Recently 11 Wyoming Valley Civil War Round Table members and friends visited the Gettysburg battlefield. This is the second time CWRT members participated in the restoration program. In the fall of 1998, the project included the scraping and painting of the picket fence around the Weikert house. The project this fall included the painting of the wrought iron fence around a battlefield monument and the Sherfy house located on the Emmitsburg Pike.

The Wyoming Valley Civil War Round Table comprised of 75 members from the surrounding area have made an annual commitment to participate in their

volunteer program. In addition to other volunteer groups, this will help support the National Park Service in restoring and maintaining the historical battlefield. The State of Pennsylvania has 140 monuments commemorating the heroic deeds of men from Pennsylvania during the three day struggle on July 1-3, 1863.
