Students take a gustatory trip around the globe

The menu included cooked cassava melon, crab sushi, potato scones and kalupsie soup, and the servers looked like they had just arrived at JFK for a multi-cultural trade fair. That's how it feels to attend the International Dinner, held each year in the cafeteria at Lake-Lehman High School, which was transformed Monday evening into a gustatory and esthetic delight.

But it's hard to get a ticket. Rich Gorgone, who team teaches the Humanities II class with Sandy Weyman, said the room can only accommodate parents, school board members, administration and "people who help a lot." That includes Joanna Oliver's grandmother, who helped her group prepare the Poland table, which represented a Christmas dinner in the old country.

The sophomore advanced placement class is used to teach history and English in one package. For the dinner, the students research the customs, dress and

food of the country they select, and in addition to putting on a meal each group does a skit in the auditorium before the cafeteria doors open to guests. Research is conducted in the school library, on the Internet and with family and friends. The dinner serves as a report.

Students choose the country they wish to portray, and form groups on their own. Leigh Dodson said her group picked Brazil, "Because no one else is doing it, and it was never done before." Heather Prescott said Japan is "just an interesting culture," and that inspired the group she was in.




a lot of time.
