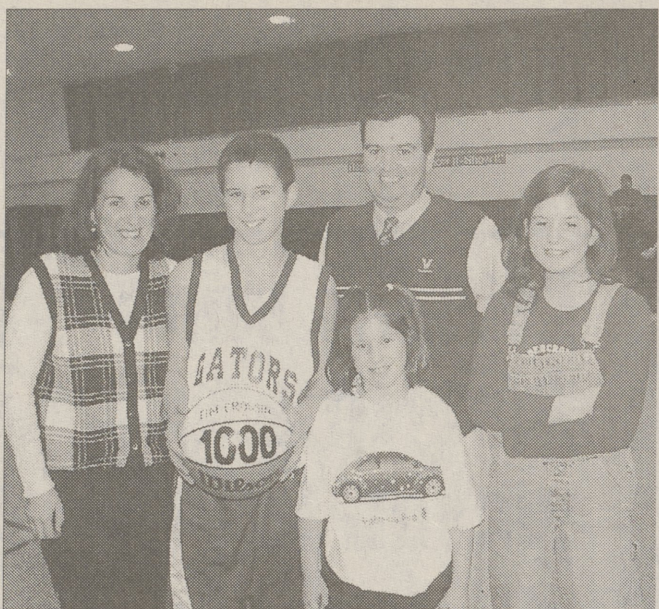

They are: Rodger Bearde, long-time coach and athletic director; David Penkrot, a 1981 graduate who still holds the school scoring record; and Rich Davis, a 1993 graduate who went on to be captain of the Franklin & Marshall University basketball team.

John Oliver, high school principal, introduced the inductees, each of whom received a plaque signifying the honor. Here's more about their athletic and academic accomplishments:

- All-scholastic in baseball, football and basketball at Spring Ford High School.
- Named Outstanding 3-Sport Athlete for Berks, Chester and Montgomery counties his senior year.

- Graduate of West Chester University.
- Coached two years at Perkiomen Valley High School, six years at Warwick High School, eight years at Wilkes College, 20 years at Lake-Lehman High School.
- Teams made nine playoff appearances and won two Wyoming Valley Conference championships. '92-'93 team advanced to Eastern semi-finals in state playoffs, most of any Lake-Lehman boys basketball team.
