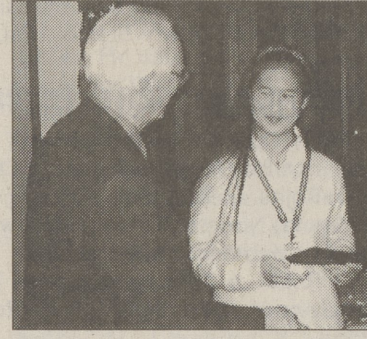
Rotary Student Ambassador speaks to club members
