that vote, Robert Allardyce moved that taxes be cut 10 mills, and Lois Kopcha seconded the motion, but it gained no more support. Allardyce walked out immediately atter vo

Decesaris was the most vocal
of the budget's opponents. "I'm not for a millage increase. I'm not for a millage decrease," he said. "I want a proper budget." He cited policy 603 , which states that any
surplus in the budget must be applied against taxes to be raised locally for subsequent budgets. "We don't intend to do that," said Gary Miller, board president Decesaris responded, Do you
expect the board to vote on a policy violation?" Board member Ed Kern cited past practice as a reason the board should vote on the budget as read.

should be driven by the curriculum, not by millage figures. "We do not have the space, we do not
