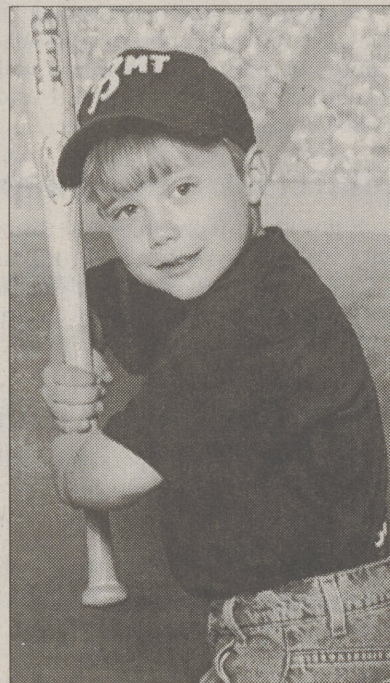
Ham 'n' Yeggs contributors to auction
