## **Chicory House dance for the whole family**

This month's New England Contra dance sponsored by the Chicory House and the Folklore Society, highlights the talents of a family based band with live music and calling talent from central Pennsylvania. The event occurs on Saturday, June 10, starting at 8 p.m. at St. Therese's Catholic Church, Pioneer Avenue, Shavertown.

Contra dancing is a multigenerational community dance that is aerobic, fun, and sociable. The dance tradition fosters a spirit of helpfulness towards newcomers, and organizers stress that dancers may come without prior experience or a partner. All of the contra dances are taught and called, and

newcomers are welcomed every month. The caller for the dance will be Bruce Young. He is a part of the "Family Band," an unusual collection of talent consisting of three fathers and their teen-aged children sharing diverse musical interests and performing together. They have been playing together as a seven piece unit since 1996.

The Chicory house is an all-volunteer non-profit coffeehouse sponsoring folk music and dance in the Wyoming Valley. Admission to the dance is \$6 for adults and \$3 for children, \$15 for families. Dancers are asked to bring a snack to share at intermission and should wear light weight clothing. Soft soled, non-marking shoes are requested to help preserve the wood dance floor. 
