

'Scouting for Food' wins honor for Girl and Boy Scout councils

Four local Girl Scout and Boy Scout Councils have won a national award in the 27th Colgate Youth For America program which honors young people for their outstanding and innovative contributions to their communities and who demonstrate commitment to making a difference in the lives of others. The Scout Councils received this award for Scouting For Food 2000, a mid-winter food drive in which nearly 5,000 girls and boys in 10 counties collected and donated over 201,000 pounds of food to over 70 food pantries, soup kitchens and shelters throughout the region.

Penn's Woods and Scranton Pocono Girl Scout Councils and the Columbia-Montour and the Northeastern Pennsylvania Councils of the Boy Scouts of America worked together to make Scouting for Food the award winning project.

In a post-project survey, 97 percent of the Troops reported that participation in Scouting For Food helped them learn the importance of community service while 91 percent gained a greater appreciation for the needs of others. The Councils, with the help of the Commission on Economic Opportunity, are designing a special patch program which Scouting For Food participants will be able to earn as they learn more about the whole issue of hunger and nutrition. Scouting For Food was the first time that the four Scout Councils worked together to undertake such a large project.

The Colgate Youth for America program, currently in its 27th year, invites U. S. clubs and troops from six youth serving organizations: Girl Scouts, Boy Scouts, 4-H, Camp Fire Girls Incorporated, and Boys and Girls Clubs, to enter their best community service projects in this annual national campaign.

Beach Ass'n open house, flea market June 25

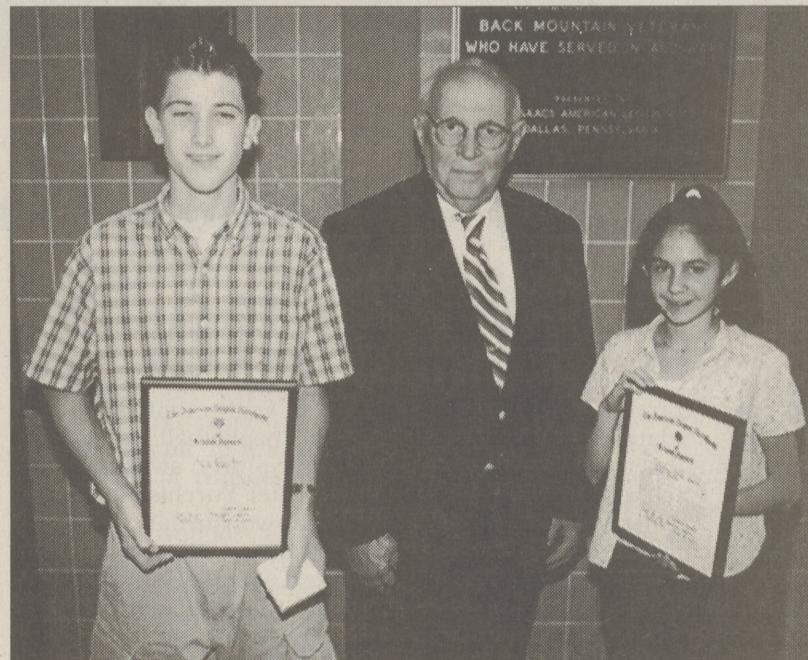
