
## Lorah earns nursing degree from Univ. of Pittsburgh

## Lake-Lehman teams win at 'The Stock Market Game'

The Stock Market Game is a ten week simulation during which students from three grade categories (4-6, 7-8, 9-12) invest an imaginary \$100,000 by buying stocks listed on the major securi-

Two teams from Lake-Lehman ties exchanges (New York, American and NASDAQ). Students who compete in the Game not only learn how financial markets operate, but hone their mathematics and decision making skills as well. Separate 10-week competitions are held in the fall and spring. Team rankings are based on finals portfolio values.

Teams that finished first, second, and third in their categories (fall and spring) from the area served by the University of Scranton Center for Economic Education were recognized at a June awards ceremony. A team from Lake-Lehman finished second in the 4-6 grade category at the end of the spring 2000 competition.

Team members Nick Leonard and Dave Kowalek finished with a portfolio of over \$119,000 to take the 9-12 first place award. Although some of their stock picks were the product of pure luck, research led them to select Greenthumb, Inc., and Nutrition,
