# Starship with Mickey Thomas to appear in Pittston

Mickey Thomas made his mark in 1976 as the lead vocalist on the mega-hit "Fooled Around and Fell in Love," by the Elvin Bishop Band. In 1979, Mickey left Elvin Bishop to join the Starship as their lead vocalist. The success was amazing as Starship cranked out five #1 hit songs with Mickey's vocals leading the way. Starship first scored a #1 hit with "Jane." With Mickey as the new lead singer, Starship then continued on to record an amazing string of hits including additional #1 smashes "No Way Out," "We Built This City," "Nothing's Gonna Stop Us Now," and "Sarah," which was written for Mickey's wife Sarah.
