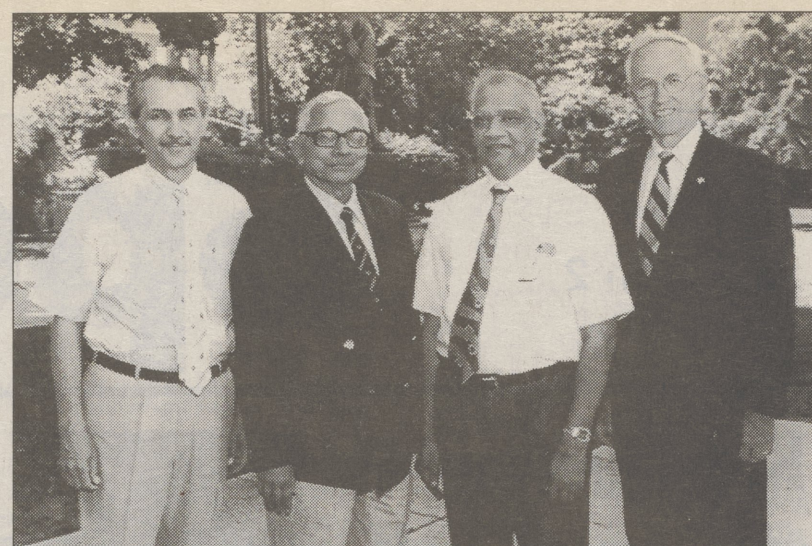

Wilkes hosts J.S.S. officials

Wilkes University recently hosted officials from J.S.S. Educational System of India to discuss a cooperative venture that will provide students and faculty from both institutions opportunities for cultural and educational exchange.

Wilkes and J.S.S. articulated their objectives in a Memorandum of Cooperation (MOC) and agreed to undertake an educational program built on mutual cooperation and understanding. This education arrangement allows for exchange of faculty and

students to each school, providing options for joint research, participation in publications, conferences and seminars. Another goal is conducting special short-term educational programs for J.S.S. students and faculty which will help develop the US style of engineering curriculum at J.S.S.

J.S.S. comprises more than 113 primary, secondary, and higher educational institutions in the southern and central parts of India. Programs range from Engineering to Pharmacy and Medical degrees.

Pollock named to Syracuse U dean's list

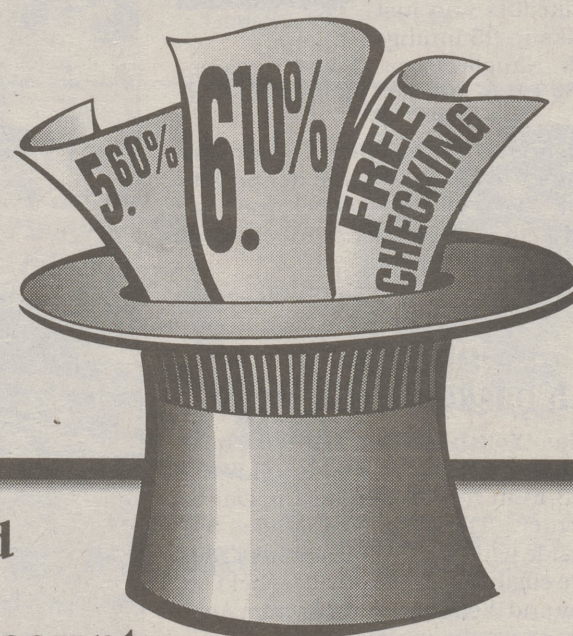
