Farmer's market/craft show vendors needed

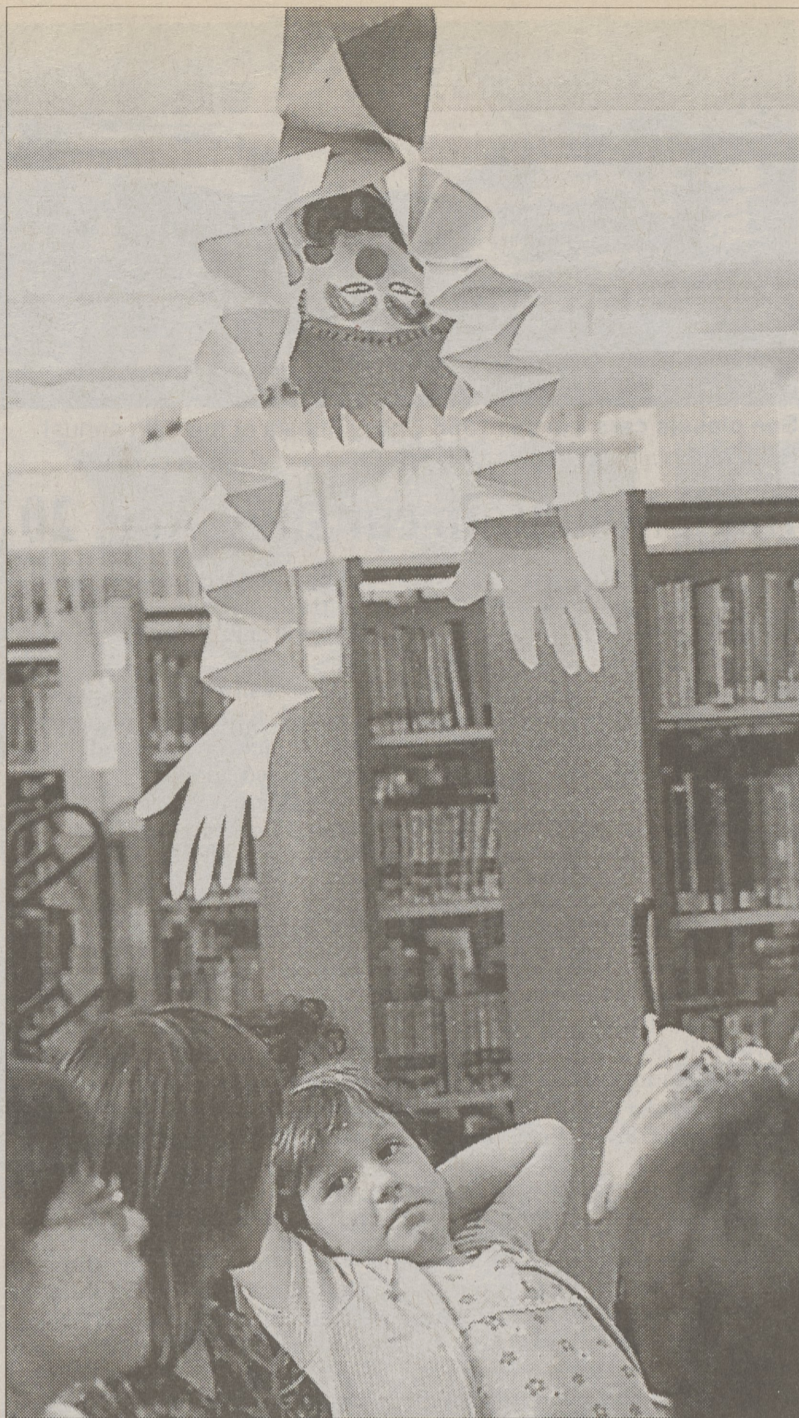

Dallas Borough Council seeks new member

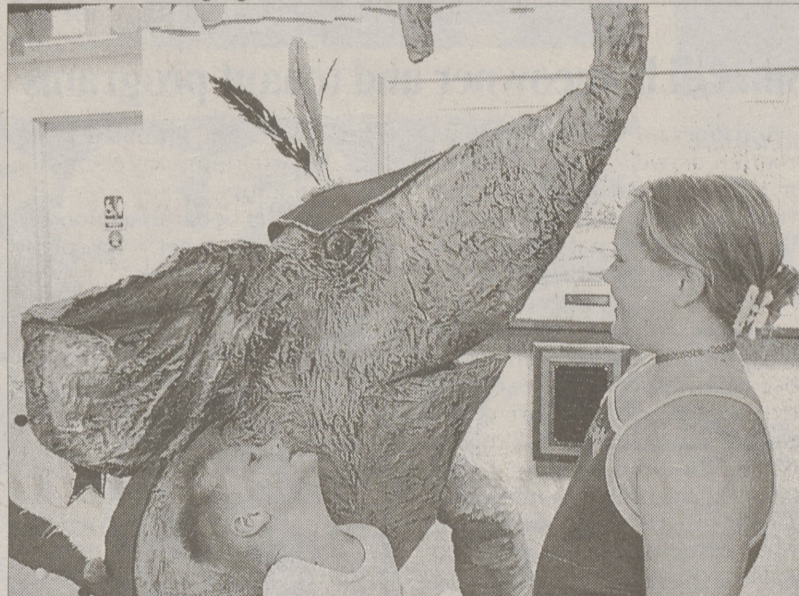
At the last regular meeting of the Dallas Borough Council, held on July 18, the resignation of Council member Charles Kane was accepted.

A total of about 60 children attended the Magic Awards Program Aug. 4, the final special event for participants in the Back Mountain Memorial Library's summer reading program, Readers 2000: Masters of the Millennium.
