

Hurwitz earns science fellowship

Michael D. Hurwitz, son of Stephen and Linda Hurwitz of Shavertown, has been awarded the 2000-2001 American Meteorological Society/Office of Naval Research Graduate Fellowship. With the fellowship, Hurwitz will pursue a Ph.D in meteorology at The Pennsylvania State University.

The AMS/Industry/Government fellowship program, now in its tenth year, attracts promising young scientists to prepare for careers in the atmospheric and related oceanic and hydrologic sciences. The program recruits promising young people entering their first year of graduate study, from a wide range of interests: meteorology, physics, mathematics, hydrology, oceanography, marine science, computer science, and engineer-

ing. The graduate fellowship which carries a nine-month, \$15,000 stipend, is one of 19 awarded by the AMS, four major high-technology firms, and six federal agencies.

Hurwitz recently graduated from Williams College with a bachelor's degree in chemistry. While an undergraduate, he received the chemistry achievement award for excellence in organic chemistry, among other awards. Hurwitz is primarily interested in severe weather phenomena.

The Office of Naval Research (ONR) coordinates, executes, and promotes the science and technology programs of the United States Navy and Marine Corps through universities, government laboratories, and nonprofit and for-profit organizations.

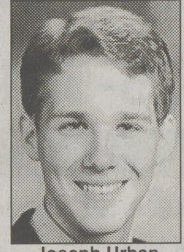
'All about me' celebration September 12

Urban will attend national young leaders conference

Joseph Urban of Dallas has been selected to attend The National Young Leaders Conference (NYLC) from October 10 to October 15, in Washington D.C. The NYLC is a unique leadership development program for high school students who have demonstrated leadership potential and scholastic merit. Urban will be among 350 outstanding National Scholars from around the country to attend the conference.

Urban, a Dallas High School junior, is a high honors student, a two-time NEDT award recipient, and a member of various school clubs.

Urban is currently president of the Dallas High School Environmental Club. He lectures and teaches CCD at Gate of Heaven Church, Dallas, and is employed part-time by the Meadows Nursing Center as an activities assistant.

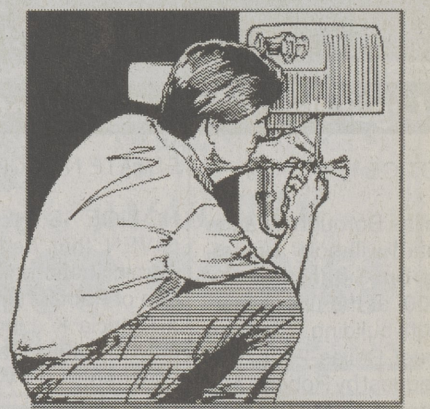
