



While several team members were absent, the teams produced several outstanding performances with Peter Miller (Junior) finishing 17th, Floyd Mattie (sr.) finishing 60th of 283 runners. On the girls team, Jamie Bozentka (soph.) finshed 27th, Jill Youngblood (Junior) 61st, and Maria Bednash (Jr.) 71st of 223 runners.


