Award-winning writer will speak about land planning

This year the focus of the Luzerne County Cooperative Extension annual meeting will be Creating Livable Communities, a subject that should interest all that are concerned with the economic, social, and environmental health of our communities. The Meeting and Dinner will be held on Wed., Oct. 25, beginning at 6:30 p.m., at the Best Western Genetti Hotel in Wilkes-Barre.

The keynote address "Cities, Villages and Towns: A Sensible Way of Life" will be given by Thomas Hylton, the Pulitzer Prize-Winning journalist and author of *Save Our Land, Save Our Towns: A Plan for Pennsylvania*. Mr. Hylton will present how a new concept in government, comprehensive planning, will provide a better future for Pennsylvania's citizens.

Since publication of the book in 1995, Hylton has given more than 200 slide presentations in Pennsylvania and 21 other states on land use planning and community building. He has given talk to legislators sponsored by both the Democratic and Republican caucuses of the Pennsylvania House and Senate. His book has been distributed to every legislator and 500 other state and local officials by James Seif, Pennsylvania Secretary of Environmental Protection. Hylton is also an organizing member of 10,000

Friends of Pennsylvania, a coalition of civic groups dedicated to land use reforms and community building in Pennsylvania. Most recently, Hylton has also hosted Saving Pennsylvania, an hour-long documentary based on Save Our Land that premiered on Pennsylvania's seven public broadcasting stations in the spring of 2000.

A native of Wyomissing, Hylton has lived all of his life in Pennsylvania cities and towns. Since 1973, Hylton has lived in Pottstown with his wife, Frances, an elementary school teacher in the Pottstown School District. For 22 years, he wrote for Pottstown's daily newspaper, The Mercury. His editorials advocating the preservation of farmland and open space in southeastern Pennsylvania won a Pulitzer Prize in 1990.

A three-time winner of the American Planning Association's annual journalism award, Hylton received a fellowship from the Society of Professional Journalists in 1993 to study comprehensive state planning. His book is based on that research.

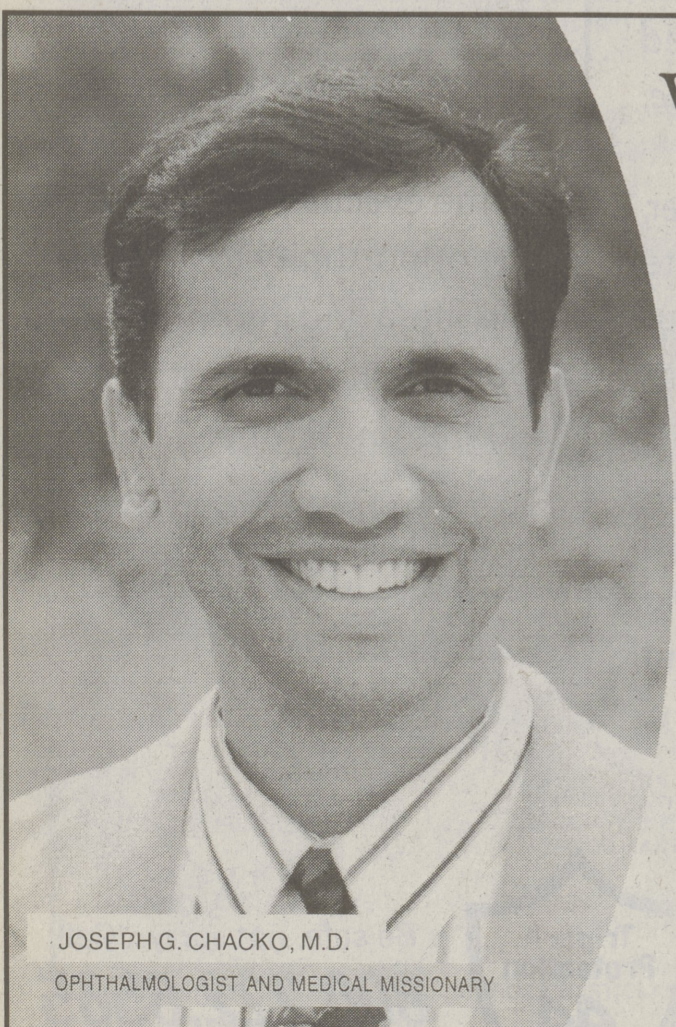
