

Back Mountain Trail receives \$5,000 grant

The Back Mountain Trail received \$5,000 from Representative George Hasay to use for the construction of the Trucksville Trailhead. It is located next to Trucksville Pharmacy on Carverton Road. DCED (Department of Community Economic Development) funds are being specifically used for this purpose.

The Back Mountain Trail extension from Post Road to Carverton was made possible by an easement agreement between Anthracite Scenic Trails Association (ASTA) and Kingston Township. Recently, Jay Elston, contractor, opened the Trail. The Trailhead is open for use, but will not be completed until summer of 2001. A design must be submitted by ASTA, approved by the Kingston Township Supervisors, and accepted by the Trucksville Pharmacy first.

The Back Mountain Trail is presently submitting a grant application to DCNR (Department of Conservation and Natural Resources) to contract for engineering services for twelve more miles of Trail development. A public meeting will be held at the Kingston Township Building on Nov. 2, at 7 p.m. on East Center St. in Shavertown to discuss this extension from Kirby Park to Luzerne Borough and Trucksville to Harveys Lake through Shavertown, Dallas Borough and Dallas Township. ASTA has already received \$480,000 from PennDOT and the Federal Highway agency under Transportation Enhancement Act 21 for construction costs.
