will play for **EC** title


The Dallas Mountaineers ended their three-game losing streak by romping over North Penn 49-6 at home on Saturday. Dallas now advances to this Saturday's Eastern Conference Division III championship game against Allentown Central Catholic. Kickoff is scheduled for 10 a.m. at Mountaineer Stadium.

This past week A.J. Harris scored two touchdowns and went over the 100-tackle mark on the season in leading the attack. Scoring early and often was the name of the game as Dallas had touchdowns on its first three drives of the contest.

Quarterback Chuck Suppon passed for 153 yards by completing seven of his nine pass attempts, two of which went for scores.

Senior tailback Cory Gallant ran for 128 yards and two touchdowns as the Dallas line helped keep the weaker North Penn line on its heals all after-


Dallas gained 446 yards over the four quarters of play. North Penn netted six years of offense in the third quarter.
