## 'Tributary' plays for Contra dance

A New England Contra dance sponsored by the Chicory House and the Folklore Society will feature the band "Tributary," with Syracuse caller David Smuckler. The dance will take place on Saturday Dec. 9, at 8 p.m. at St. Therese's Church, Pioneer Avenue at Davis Street in Shavertown, just off Rt. 309.

Tributary plays and sings traditional music with an old-style flavor — the jigs, reels, hornpipes, waltzes, quadrilles, schottisches, and polkas handed down over the years for contras, squares, and round-dancing. The band consists of Curt Osgood of Binghamton, playing hammered dulcimer, and Kathy Shimberg from Mt. Vision,

NY, on piano or fiddle. They will be accompanied by Bill Myers of Binghamton on low and high whistles.

David Smuckler, the caller, will guide new and experienced dancers alike through a variety of dances. Contra dancing is moderately aerobic, so dancers are encouraged to dress in light weight, casual clothing.

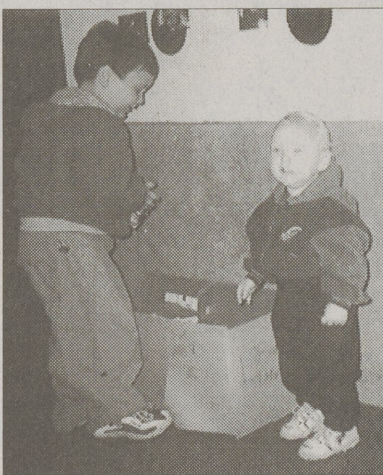
