Food drive is a big success

Individuals and organizations from throughout the area responded with enthusiasm to a plea to restock the Back Mountain Food Bank with loads of contributions after an article about the institution's plight appeared in the Nov. 15 issue of The Dallas Post.

"We got an onslaught of food when the article ran," said Barbara DeBellis, secretary of Trucksville United Methodist Church, who coordinates the food bank's activities. "The Back Mountain has been so supportive."

Before the food drive began, DeBellis said she had been telling people it might be three or four weeks before their requests for food could be met. The she was able to call them back to say food was available.

The initial response meant a happy Thanksgiving for eight families, who were added to the holiday list when turkeys were donated. "We ended up calling additional families," DeBellis said. The publicity also attracted nine families who didn't realize there was a food bank in the Back Mountain.

"Food has been coming in as quickly as it's going out," DeBellis said. But, she added: "Things are going good, but we could always use more."
