

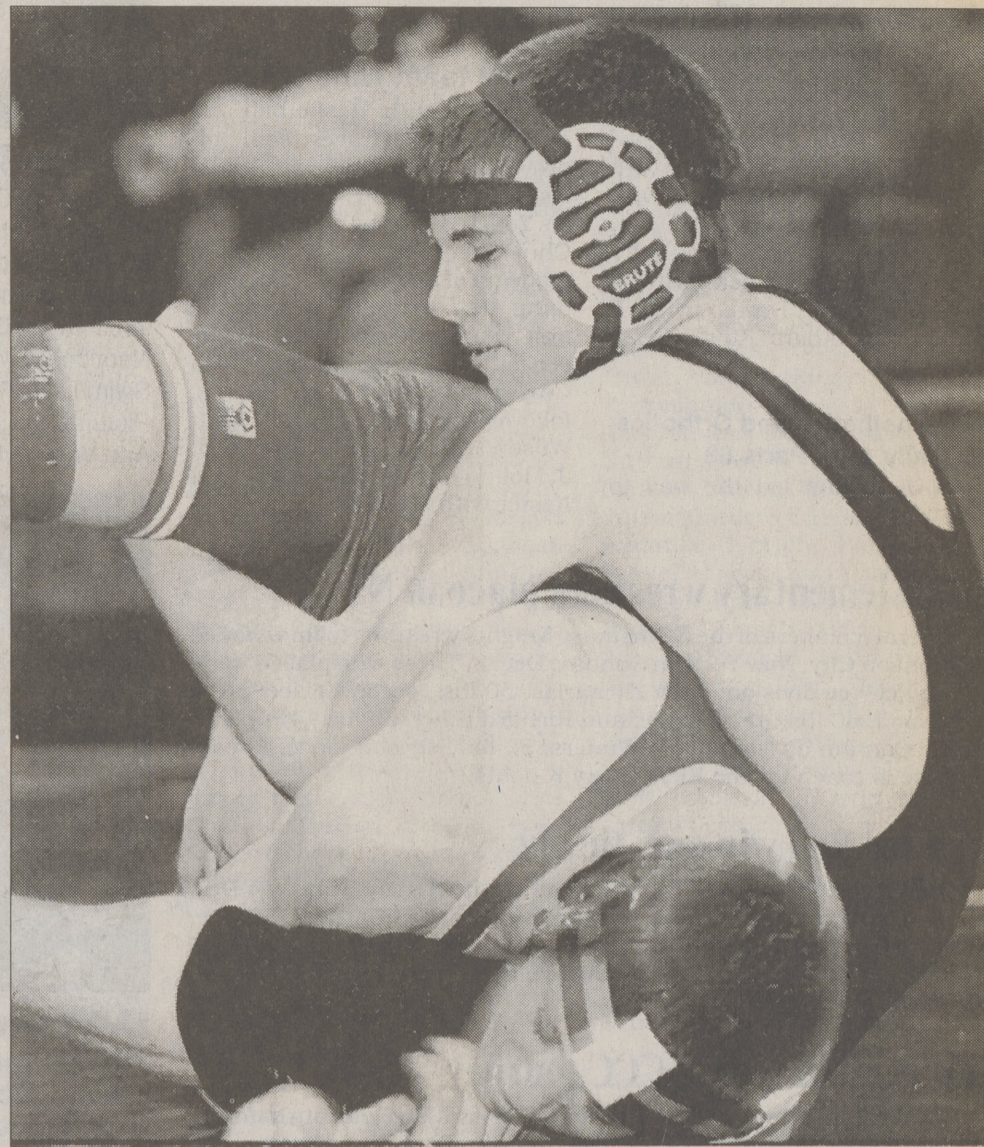
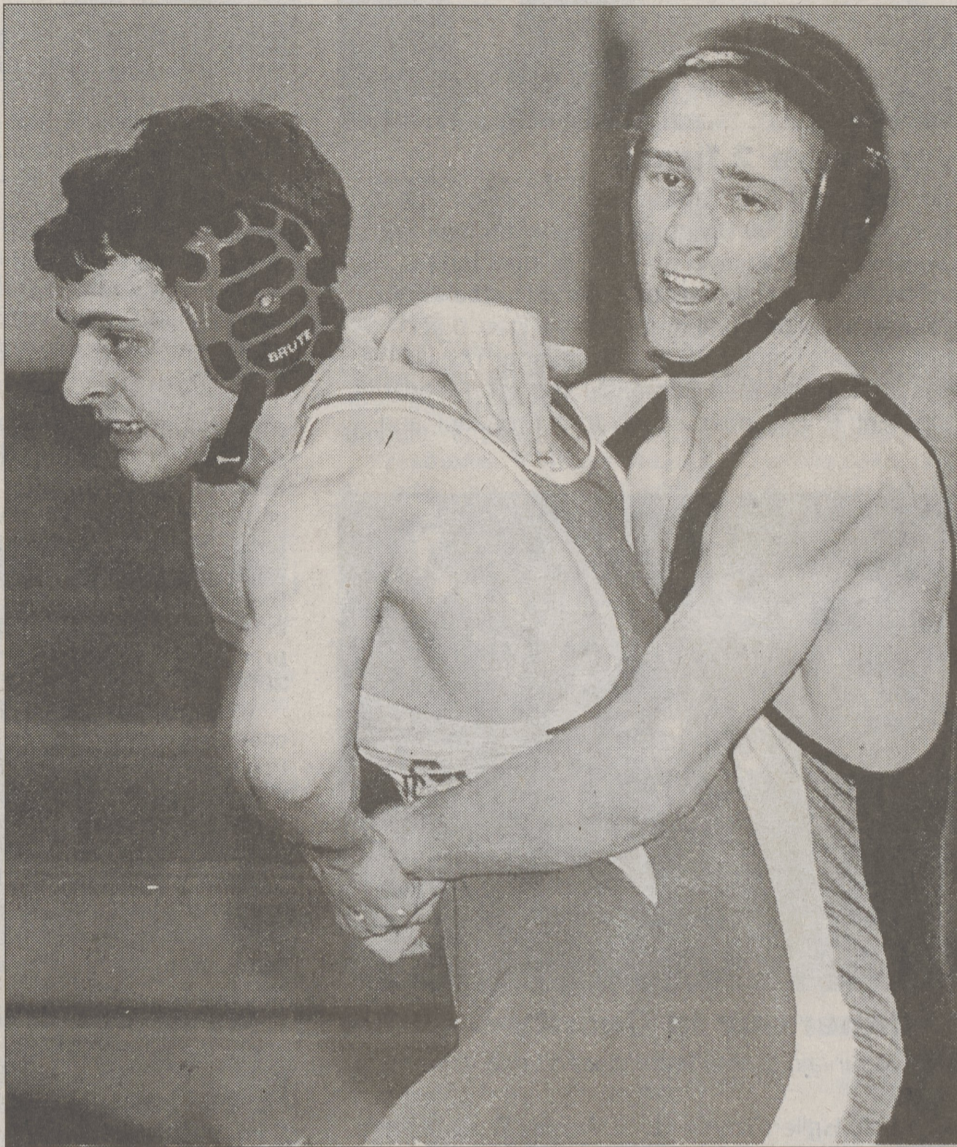
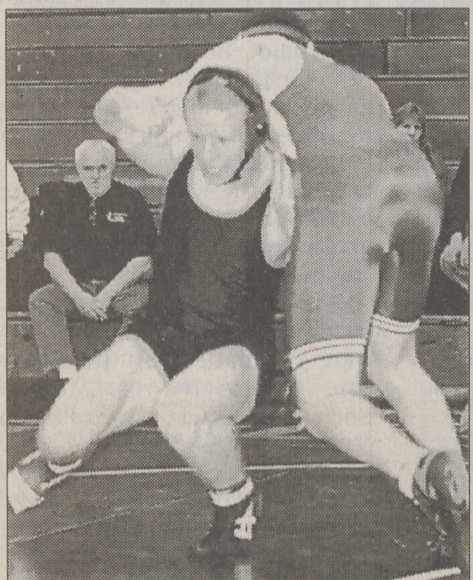

Perkoski named a 2nd team All-American

Former Dallas high School star Frank Perkoski has been selected a second-team All-American by the National Junior College Athletic Association after concluding a successful career at Lackawanna Junior College. Perkoski, a 6-2, 274-pound offensive guard, was one of the reasons Lackawanna finished third in the nation in rushing offense (294.6 average) and fourth in total offense (437.2). He also helped pave the way for teammate Alan Jones, the country's leading scorer and rusher in junior college football, to earn a first-team All-American berth. Perkoski was a defensive lineman at Lackawanna last season and comforted himself well. However, with a need to shore up the offensive line, the coaching staff moved him to the other side of the ball.
