# Lisa Moscatiello coming to Chicory House

Maryland-based singer-songwriter Lisa Moscatiello will perform at the Chicory House in Wilkes-Barre Friday, Jan. 12 at 8 p.m. The concert will be held in the Community Room of St. Stephen's Episcopal Church, 35 South Franklin St., across from Boscov's parking garage. Tickets are \$10, or \$8 for supporting members.

Moscatiello will be accompanied by Sue Richards, a national Scottish harp champion, and Fred Lieder, a well-known jazz cellist. She has performed several times before in the region, both solo and with the Celtic-influenced group Whirligig. Her compact disc *Second Avenue* was spotlighted on WVIA's Mixed Bag and this past fall she appeared on the station's Homegrown Music feature.

With roots in Irish folk, acoustic pop and country, Moscatiello has been compared to Annie Lennox, Judy Collins and kd lang. Billboard has said that Moscatiello possesses "one of the most gorgeous voices in all the folk-tinged pop," and *Dirty Linen*, a folk-rock magazine, called her "one of the finest singers in America today."

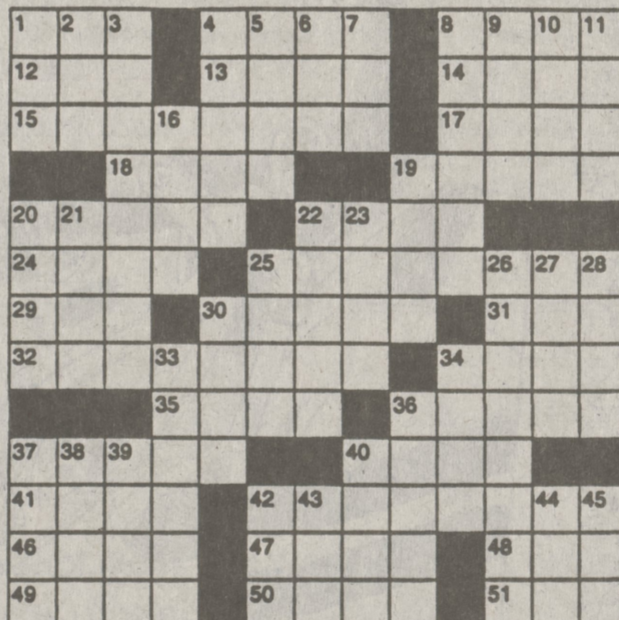

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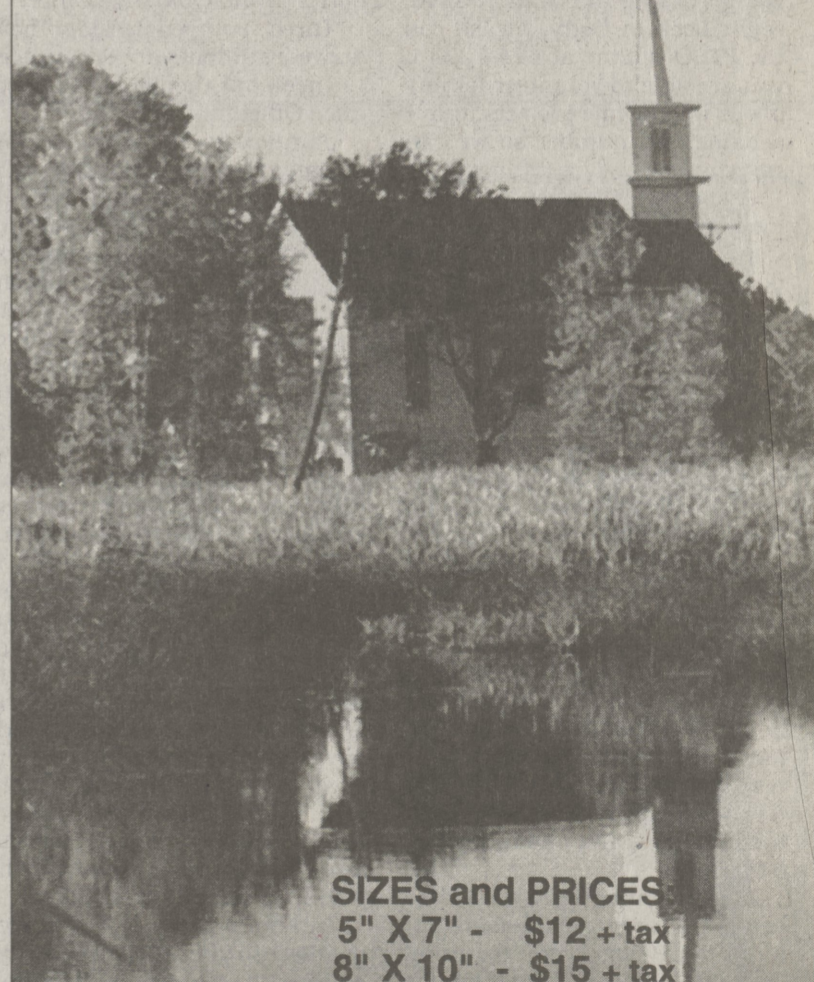
