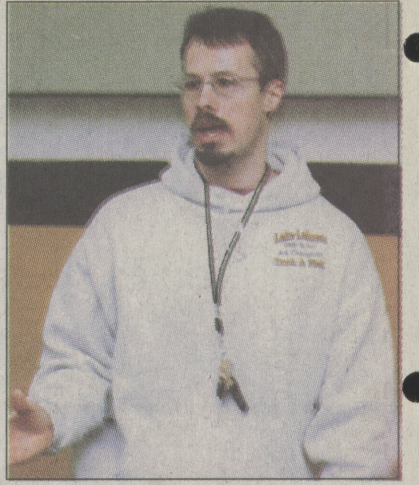

Attention customers of UNITED WATER PENNSYLVANIA INC. and the general public that are concerned with protecting the quality of the drinking water supply in the Dallas and Shavertown area(s).

The Pennsylvania Department of Environmental Protection (DEP) is holding a public meeting to introduce the Source Water Assessment Protection (SWAP) program. The SWAP program is being conducted throughout the Commonwealth by DEP to evaluate and establish protection priorities for potential sources of pollution that may affect drinking water sources.

The meeting will be held at the following date, time and location:

**PENN STATE WILKES-BARRE CAMPUS CENTER FOR TECHNOLOGY BUILDING OLD ROUTE 115, LEHMAN, PA**  
Snow date: March 29, 2001, same time and location.

DEP is inviting the general public to attend the meeting. During the meeting the public will have the opportunity to provide input to help guide the SWAP program in the local area. This meeting will also address the development of voluntary source water protection concepts. Please note that this meeting will be only to address raw water quality issues before any treatment and distribution. Currently, United Water Pennsylvania, Inc. is providing water below maximum contaminant level requirements under PA. Safe Drinking Act at the Dallas and Shavertown system(s).
