Mom still comes by to work some times or to check on her homemade entree recipes such as lasagna, pigs in the blanket, stuffed peppers, meat loaf, macaroni and cheese, and baked beans with bacon.

Health smart menu items include tossed salads, chef salads, Caesar salads, chicken salad and vegetable subs. J&J's children's menu includes such favorites as hot dogs, chicken fingers, grilled cheese and peanut butter and jelly sandwiches.

On Thursday they make pasties, and on Friday and Saturday they now make Sicilian style pizza. During the holidays, they make wonderful nut roll and poppy seed bread. There is 40 feet of cooler space filled with soda, iced tea, milk, orange juice, and 163 varieties of beer, including draft beer.

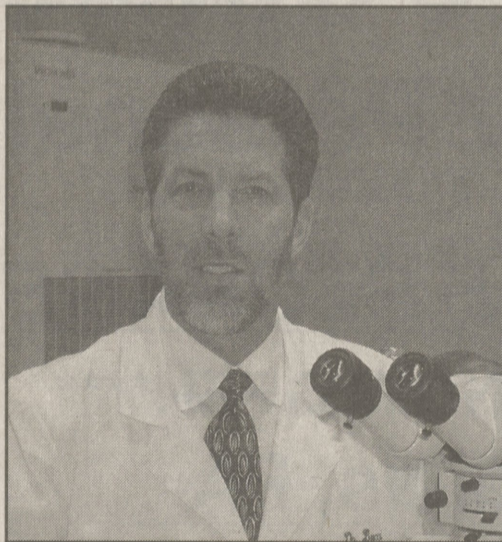
