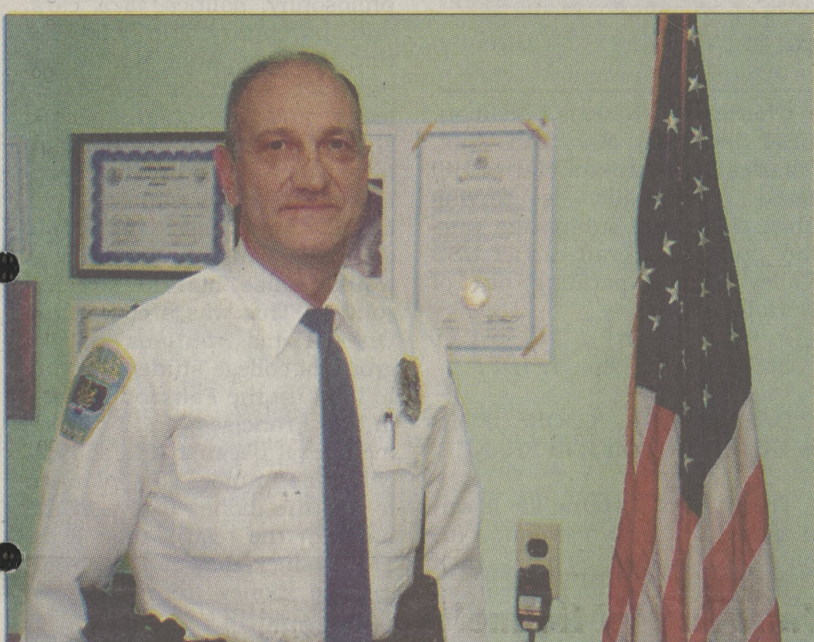
DHS players to present 'Arsenic and Old Lace'
