broker and I worked for Angel Flight, a charitable organization. We wanted a better quality of life and a slower pace to raise our daughter. Our family is here, and we wanted Sadie to grow up in a family and community environment.'

The hoagies and ice cream at Mama & Papa's are great, but the thing that is most outstanding is the way they conduct their business with a community oriented spirit that is not easily found these days.
