All political candidates who plan to post signs in Kingston Township are reminded that signs can be posted no earlier than thirty (30) days prior to any election, (April 15) and must be removed no later than thirty (30) days after the election, (June 15).

Campaign signs cannot exceed four (4) square feet in size and signs cannot be attached to fences, trees, or utility poles.

A permit to post political signs may be obtained from the Zoning Officer, in the Municipal Office at 180 East Center Street, Shavertown, daily from 8:30 to 4:30 p.m. Additional information may be obtained by calling the Zoning Officer at 696-3809.
