PWC Operators must have certification

With warm weather just around the corner, the Pennsylvania Fish and Boat Commission is reminding operators of personal watercraft (PWCs)-specialized inboard motorboats known by brand names such as Jet Ski, SeaDoo, Wave runner or Tiger Shark-that they must have an approved boating safety education certificate to operate in the Commonwealth.

Boaters can earn certification by successful completion of a Commission-approved safety course. A list of courses is available in the "Boating" section of the Commission's web site (www.fish.state.pa.us) or by calling 1-888-PA-FISH1.
