There will be a \$10 charge for the pickup service and a permit will be necessary. A fee of \$10 per major appliance and \$2 per tire is additional.

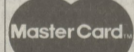
The borough has set a limit of one truckload pickup per household. Any items to be picked up must be placed at the curbside. Borough employees will not go onto private property.
