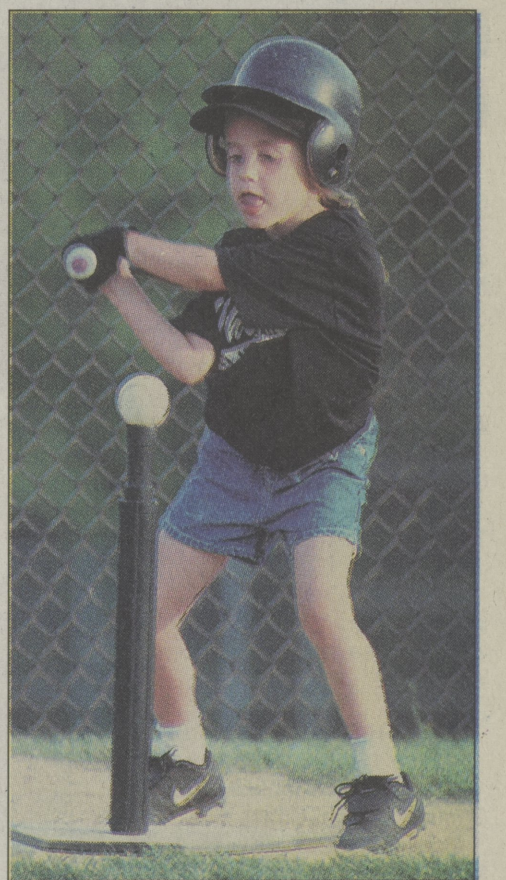
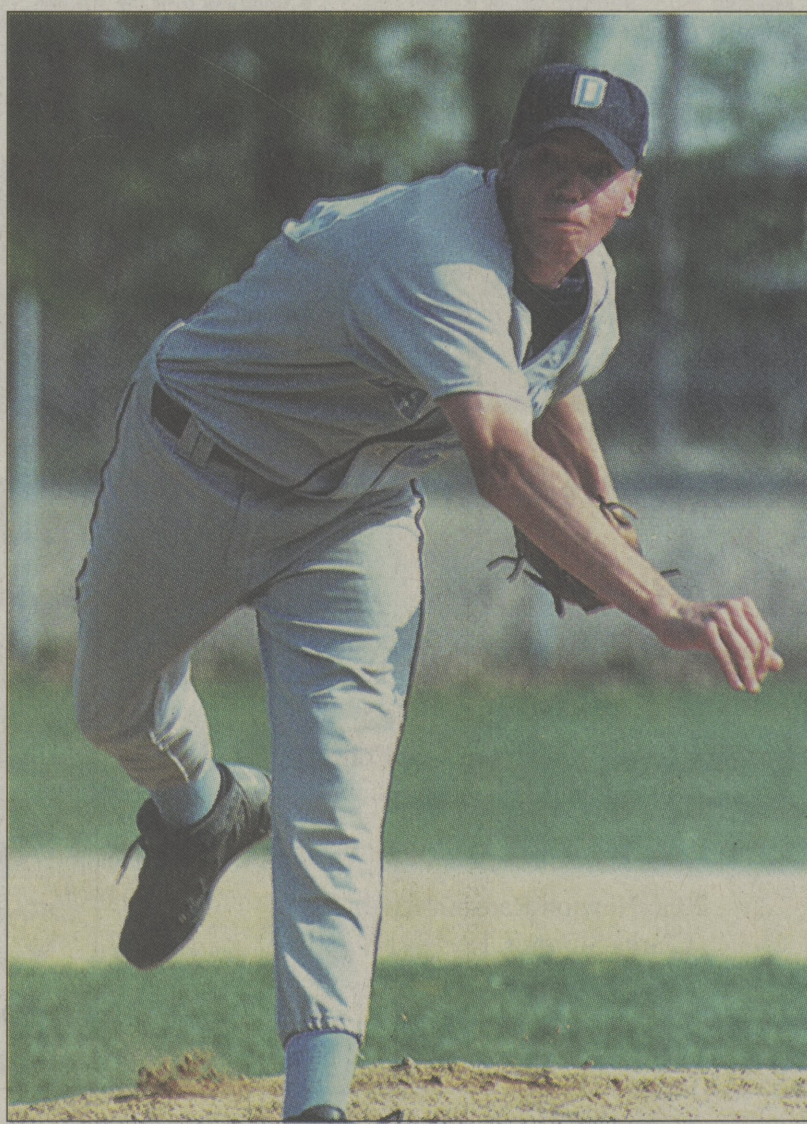
Mounts pound Comets
