Dallas won the District 2, Class AA championship last week, scoring two runs in the bottom of the sixth inning to break 1-1 tie against Meyers.

Winning pitcher Darrell Evans led off the inning with a single for his only hit of the game. After an error on an attempted pickoff, he was able to advance to second base. Josh Katyl then sacrificed him to third base. Jeremy and Adam Harris were then both intentionally walked to set up a force play at the plate. Up came Ryan Gryskevich who grounded into a force play at second but Meyers failed to complete the double play, so the inning was still alive. Evans scored on the play. A double

steal with two outs then enabled Jeremy Harris to score the Mounts' third run. Harris had also scored the first Dallas run in the fourth inning when Meyers balked while he was on third after tripling. The Mohawks tied the game in the top of the sixth.

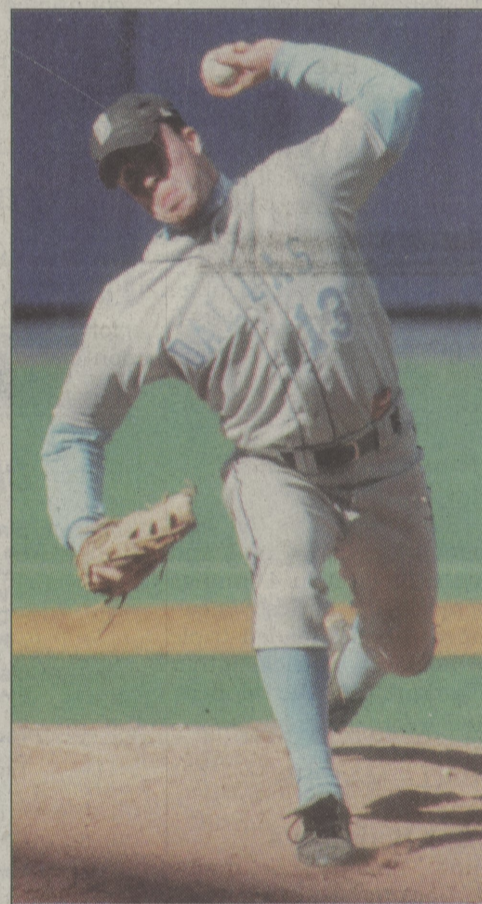
Evans finished the complete game with two strikeouts, giving up three hits and three walks and just the one unearned run.
