In the Orioles second, Conner Lenahan led off with a single, Ryan Urzan walked and Josh Clay singled to load the bases. The next Orioles batter struck out, but then Tom Parrish doubled, clearing the bases giving the Orioles the lead back at 4-2.

In the third inning both Tucker and Jerzak, who had come in to relieve Feleccia in the second, settled down and retired all batters with no runs scored by either team.

The fireworks began again in the fourth. After the first Tigers batter struck out, Precone and Ben Haughwaut drew walks. Jerzak then hit into a fielder's choice scoring Precone. Tucker was able to get the last Tigers batter and the Orioles escaped clinging to a 4-3 lead.

After the first batter struck out in the Orioles half of the fourth, consecutive singles by Clay, Matt Alfano and Parrish loaded the bases, setting the table for Adam Tamanini. His triple to right center cleared the bases and gave the Orioles a 7-3 lead. Eric Razawich then hit into a fielder's choice and Tamanini was thrown out at the plate trying to score on a perfect throw from Feleccia, playing first base.

The Tigers were able to push across two runs in the fifth thanks to a Michael Glicini single, while the Orioles were shut down by an inning-ending throw by Oliveri to second to nail Lenahan trying to stretch a hit

into a double. With the Orioles leading 7-5 beginning the sixth, the first Tiger struck out. Jerzak then doubled and Feleccia singled, scoring Jerzak and cutting the score to 7-6. The next Tigers batter struck out, bringing Chris Klaiss to the plate. With two outs and the count 0-2, he casually stroked a double off the left center field wall, scoring Feleccia and tying the game at seven. After a passed ball moved Klaiss to third, Tucker threw a ball in the dirt that catcher John Scafidu was unable to handle, but Scafidu's toss to Tucker covering home was perfect and they were able to nail Klaiss for the inning-ending out.

The Orioles were able to get a runner to third with two out in the bottom of the sixth, but Parrish's potential game-ending shot down the third base line was handled by the Tigers' Jerzak, who was able to regain his footing and throw out Parrish by a half step, sending the game into extra innings.

The Tigers were unable to mount a rally in their half of the seventh, thanks to reliever Razawich's two strikeouts. In the bottom of the seventh, Tamanini led off with a walk and then Razawich hit Jerzak's first pitch deep into the night over the center field fence, ending this marathon and giving the Orioles a 9-7 win.

The Back Mountain has a new place for hunters and shooting enthusiasts to purchase of firearms and related supplies. Matt's Shooting Supplies is located on Maple Tree Road in Dallas, offering a wide variety of products for hunters and shooter alike.

Matthew Lysiak, the owner, officially opened his new shop in 1997, but just recently began a full-scale campaign to bring in

new customers. Matt, as everyone calls him, is a knowledgeable person in the world of weapons and shooting. He is an army veteran with over 20 years and has served around the world, including the Desert Storm campaign.

Lysiak obtained the rank of 1st Sergeant and earned expert badges for shooting while in the military. He now brings his well-rounded knowledge to customers seeking advice on models and calibers on a variety of guns that he carries.

Lysiak has no dispute with the new gun laws. "I like them," he said. "The computer check makes no distinction between individuals. It's clearly yes or no. Either the government allows the customer to own a gun or they don't."

This relatively new establish-

ment has doubled its business in the last few years. Matt's Shooting Supplies now has a customer base as far north as New York State and southerly to the southeast part of Pennsylvania. Matt has an inventory of over 900 available firearms for customers to choose from, including shotguns, muzzleloaders, pistols and rifles, all in an assortment of gauges and calibers. The shop offers many other items as well, such as reloading supplies, scopes, sport-shooting accessories, gun safes and even crossbows.

Matt's also has available a custom shop that will build a gun to your needs, make caliber or accuracy modifications, or perform repair work. If you want a custom laminated thumbhole stock you can have one made and even choose what color

wood you want. "The most popular calibers these days are the 7mm-08 and the .300 ultra Magnum and the most popular manufacturers are Remington and Ruger," Lysiak said. "Most brands and calibers are on hand but some are hard to get due to supply and demand."

Matt's buys, sells and trades all types of legal firearms and accepts major credit cards. He also works with local sportsmen's clubs and fire halls when they wish to purchase guns for fundraisers. Matt's currently does not sell hunting licenses but should be selling them by next year so hunters can make all their purchases in one stop.
