The Innovation Award was presented to Brian Katyl, Dallas, computer/telecommunications specialist. This domain included a web server that gave the Radio Club the capability to broadcast live over the Internet.

sociate professor of Engineering, received the Professional Development Award. This award is given to a person who has achieved significant recognition from external colleagues in his professional field.

A Special Service Award, given to a person who is not currently employed by the campus, but has made an outstanding voluntary service contribution, was presented to Cheryl Cavaleri. Cavaleri, a Trucksville resident, has supported the campus through her work with the Northeast Regional Ministry in Higher Education. She helped institute the weekly Listening Post for students, and in conjunction with other campus personnel, she was instrumental in developing a four-part religious diversity series, and the Faith & Values Discussion Group.

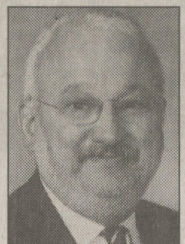
## Parente Randolph appoints Santarelli

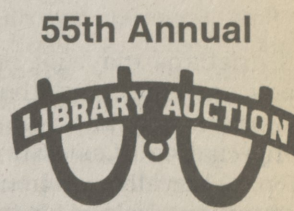

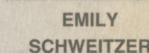
## Schweitzer graduates from Ithaca
