tions, which is provided to all license buyers. Hunters and trappers also may complete and submit applications on the Game Commission's website (www.pgc.state.pa.us) for the 30 elk licenses or 520 bobcat permits that will be awarded at public drawings. The drawing for the bobcat permits will be held Sept. 14 at the agency's Harrisburg headquarters; elk licenses will be selected on Sept. 29.

Resident hunters may begin applying for a county-specific antlerless license on Monday, Aug. 6. Non-resident hunters may begin applying for a county-specific antlerless license on Monday, Aug. 20. All hunters

may apply for the first round of unsold antlerless licenses beginning Monday, Aug. 27; the second round of unsold antlerless licenses may be applied for beginning Sept. 10.

Ross noted that with the increased hunter efficiencies expected from the new seasons and bag limits, the Board of Game Commissioners approved a statewide antlerless license allocation for the 2001-2002 seasons of 692,500 - which is lower than the previous year's allocation by 52,400.

During 2000-2001, hunters purchased all but 1,863 of the 744,900 antlerless licenses allocated.
