Players and cheerleaders treated cars to a

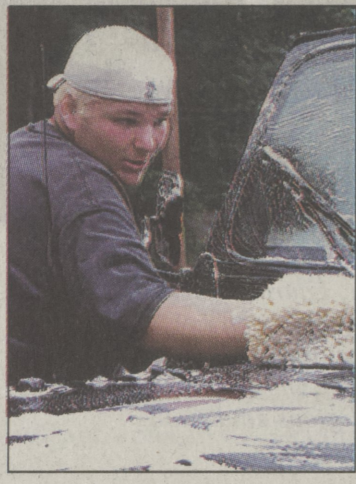
deluxe scrub on Saturday for a \$5 donation.
