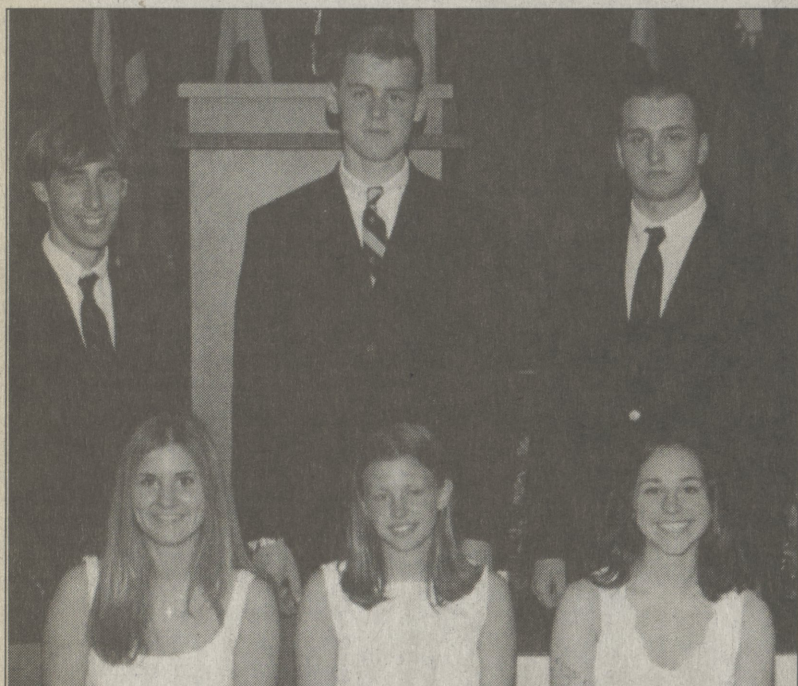

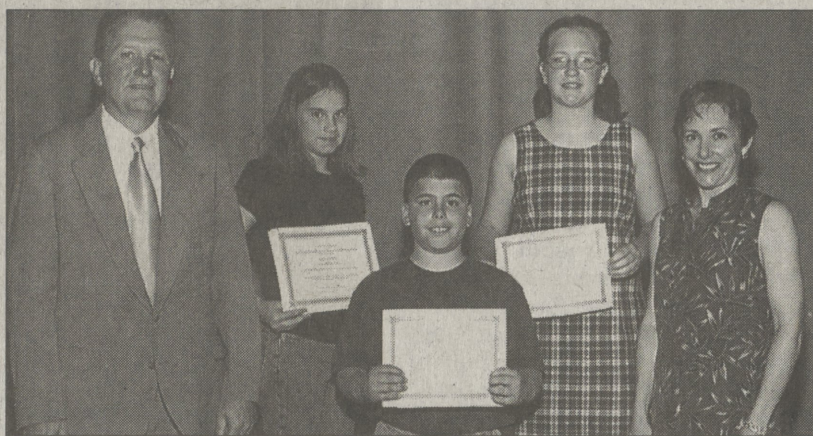
forms are available. The ACT registration deadline for the September exam is Aug. 17. If you have any questions, the guidance office is open during the summer, call the guidance department at 675-7458.
