statistics showed that Lehman played well enough to win in many departments.

Bob Langan returns for his second season at the helm of the Black Knights, along with nine starters that will fill 12 positions on the field. The Black Knights are coming off a 3-7 season that had its share of ups and downs. Lehman dropped its first contest to Hazleton before bouncing back in week two to win at playoffbound West Scranton. The Black Knights then suffered through a four-game losing streak before shutting-out Coughlin 19-0.

Lehman ended the season with some optimism for this year with a 12-7 win over Old Shoe rival Dallas in the next-to-last game of the season. Many of the faces seen in the starting lineup this season contributed in that win.

backfield The entire returns for Lehman, includquarterback Ragukas. Ragukas and tailback Josh Kuwaye earned NEPFC Division II honorable mention status in 2000.

Chris Teetsel is back as Kuwaye's lead blocker at fullback and earned first team status as a punter. Wide-receiver Troy Long and tight end Dave Strenfel also return to give Ragukas experienced targets to throw to. Jim Mahon and Phil Kasper will also see time at wide receiver.

Inexperience may be a problem on the offensive line, but Bob Roper and Gaise Lacek return to anchor the right side of the line at tackle and guard respectively. MIke Hillman will man the center spot, with Ed Little and Mike Rusonis at left guard and left tackle.

Defensively. Langan returns five starters to his 50 defense. Lasek is back at nose tackle, and Teetsel and

Strenfel will play the two safety. inside linebacker positions to give the Black Knights a solid trio up the middle. Roper and Rusonis will start at defensive tackle, and bookends Ed Becker and Ed Little will play the right and left defensive ends respectively.

Long and Mike Mully return to the defensive backfield with Long at corner and Mully at strong safety. Mahon will play the corner opposite Long, and Kuwaye will start at free

While a number of returning starters is the strength of the Black Knights during Langan's second season, the success of it may be determined by the development of the team's weakness, which is a lack of depth. If Lehman can develop some depth behind its returning players, the Black Knights should be able to attain a team goal of a winning sea-
