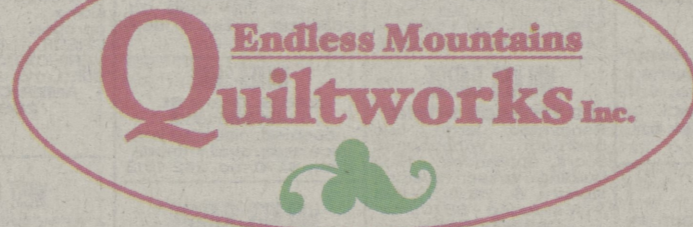

**CANCER
BASICS**

Q: Should I be screened for prostate cancer?

A: If you are a man over the age of 50, you should discuss prostate cancer screening with your doctor. If you have a strong family history of prostate cancer or if you are African American, your risk for prostate cancer is higher and you should consider screening even earlier. Your physician can provide you with information on the benefits and limitations of a Prostate Specific Antigen (PSA) blood test and a digital rectal examination (DRE) used to check for prostate cancer. NRCI is offering prostate cancer screenings September 24-27 at five area locations. The screenings include a reduced cost PSA and an examination by a physician.
