Out of 120 sixth graders, 22 students earned the opportunity to show their stuff at the Huntsville Golf Club on October 17. The students spent three weeks learning the fundamentals of golf and practicing their swings in Mr. Jeff Hynick's physical education classes.

The students reward for their hard work was an afternoon at the driving range. "They worked hard for it," Hynick said about his students.

Students were chosen for the field trip by how hard they tried, how much they improved, and their natural ability. The chance to hit a few balls at the Huntsville Golf Club really got the kids excited, said Hynick.

Lehman taxes due Nov. 6

Lehman Township Tax Collector Peggy Moyer reminds all property owners and residents that face value on 2001 school district property, and per capita taxes will end on Tuesday, Nov. 6. All payments made prior to the close of the tax collector's office hours, and those post-marked on or before the Nov. 6 deadline, will be accepted at face value.

County/municipal taxes should enclose a self-addressed stamped envelope for a paid receipt. Persons having an escrow account should have already forwarded their property tax bills to

their mortgaging company for payment.

All residents of the township 18 years of age and older are required to pay township and school per capita taxes. Anyone who's income does not exceed \$5,000 per person or \$10,000 per married couple, may apply to the Lake-Lehman School District for exoneration from the per capita tax.

Office hours for the end of face value will be Nov. 2, 5, and 6, 10 a.m. to 5 p.m. Penalty value will be effective Nov. 7 through Dec. 6, with office hours by appointment.

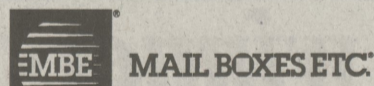

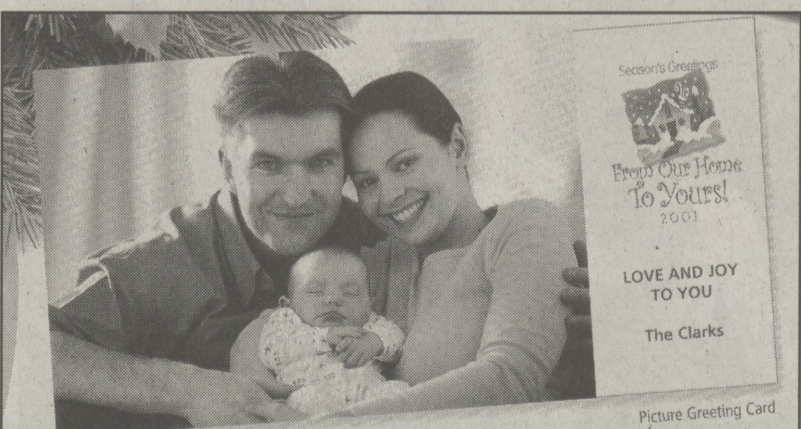

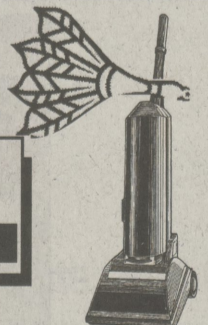
