

Game Commission holiday gifts

Looking for some really "wild" holiday gift-giving ideas? Dozens of wildlife-related gift selections are just a click away on "The Outdoor Shop," which is available on the Pennsylvania Game Commission's website (www.pgc.state.pa.us).

New this year is the Game Commission 2002 calendar, priced at \$8.95 (plus tax). It features a year's worth of dramatic wildlife photos taken by Game Commission employees and includes dates for the remaining and tentative dates for the 2002 hunting and trapping seasons. The calendar also includes hunting and wildlife-related tips, interesting wildlife facts and references to information available on the agency's website.

January through November features a full-color photo of a different wildlife species, including: a snowshoe hare; a black-capped chickadee; a wood duck; nesting bald eagles; wild turkeys; a raccoon; a great egret; a saw-whet owl; a bull elk; a ruffed grouse; and a white-tailed deer. December displays a picturesque scene from inside a vintage hunting cabin.

Also new this year are a special fine art print, t-shirts and patches to commemorate the state's first elk hunt in seven decades. The t-shirt and patch are based on the art print, which was done by renowned wildlife artist, Gerald W. Putt.

Other gift ideas range from as little as \$3 for a Game Commission "Wildlife Conservation Stamp," which can be used as a stocking stuffer, to that really special gift of a "Working Together for Wildlife" or "Duck Stamp" fine art print, which cost up to \$135.

Revenues generated from the sale of conservation stamps, duck stamps and fine art prints are used by the Game Commission to acquire additional State Game Lands; improve wildlife habitats; preserve critical habitats, such as wetlands; and for other wildlife research and management programs.

Know someone who wants to see and learn more about Pennsylvania's white-tailed deer, black bear and elk? The Game Commission is making a special "buy two, get a third free" offer of its three-feature length videos. For the price of \$58.48 (plus tax), you can receive one of each or any combination of the agency's three award-winning videos: On the Trail of Pennsylvania's Black Bears; Pennsylvania's White-tails, Living with Change; and Pennsylvania Elk: Reclaiming the Alleghenies. Videos also may be purchased separately for a cost of \$29.24 (plus tax).

Another popular holiday gift is a subscription to Pennsylvania Game News, the Game Commission's official, monthly magazine. Anybody who enjoys the outdoors and wildlife will appreciate 12 months of reading pleasure for \$12. It will be as close as their mailbox.
