Edgar Hughes Jr.
Former principal of Dallas High School

Edgar W. Hughes Jr., 77, of Overbrook Road, Dallas, died Friday Nov. 2, 2001 at Mercy Hospital, Wilkes-Barre.

Born in Kingston, he was the son of the late Edgar W. Sr. and Thelma (Hershberger) Hughes. He was a graduate of Plymouth High School and received a bachelor of arts degree in history from Lafayette College, and a master's degree in history and principal's certificate from the University of Scranton.

He began his teaching career in 1949 in Dallas Township High School, retiring as principal of Dallas High School in 1993. He began the first Rod & Gun Club of Dallas High School and was senior class adviser for his entire teaching career.

He also taught history at Wilkes University and Luzerne County Community College. After retiring, he was fuel assistance coordinator

for Luzerne County Department of Welfare. He was a U.S. Army veteran of World War II, serving in North Africa.

He was a member of Shavertown United Methodist Church, Kingston Lodge 395 F & AM, Keystone Consistory, Scranton, Irem Temple, Wilkes Barre, Daddow Isaacs American Legion Post 672, Dallas, past president of the Retired Principal's Association of Luzerne County, Pennsylvania State Education Association, National Education Association and the North Lake Improvement Association, Sweet Valley. He was also a member of Sigma Chi at Lafayette College and Phi Alpha Theta Historical Society.

Surviving are his wife of 54 years, the former Jean McCabe; daughter, Joyce Hourigan, West Pittston; and two granddaughters.

Sister Regina Kelly
Member of Dallas Regional Community of the Sisters of Mercy

Sister Regina Kelly, a member of the Dallas Regional Community of the Sisters of Mercy of the Americas, died Tuesday Oct. 30, 2001 at Mercy Hospital, Wilkes-Barre.

Born July 12, 1921 in Wilkes-Barre, she was a daughter of the late Matthew and Anna (McGarvey) Kelly. She was a 1939 graduate of St. Mary's High School, Wilkes-Barre, and earned a bachelor's degree in English from College Misericordia, a master's degree in English from the Catholic University of America, Washington, D.C., and Ph.D. in English from Fordham University, New York. She was also awarded an honorary doctorate from College Misericordia in 1999. She pursued post-doctoral studies at Cambridge University, London, England. She entered the Sisters of Mercy in Dallas, on Sept. 8, 1944. She was given the name Sister Maria del Rey, but returned to her baptismal name in 1966. She pronounced her vows on March 12, 1947. She taught at St. Mary's High School, Wilkes-Barre, St. Ann's High School, Freeland, St. Vincent's High School, Plymouth, and St. Gabriel's High School, Hazleton, all in the Diocese of Scranton. She was affiliated with College Misericordia, Dallas, from 1964 until her death. During that time she served on the faculty, becoming a full professor.

From 1967 to 1971, she was an academic dean and was chair of the Honors Program from 1985 to 1992. She had numerous writings published, including Remember Me Affectionately to All, a biography of Catherine McAuley, founder of the Sisters of Mercy; a history of College Misericordia, At the Edge of the Centuries, College Misericordia, 1913-1999, which she co-authored with Agnes Cardoni; the histories of Mercy Hospital, Scranton, and Mercy Hospital, Wilkes-Barre. She also had many of her poems published in well-known periodicals. She was the founder of the Shakespeare Symposium in 1986 at College Misericordia, officially named the Dr. Regina Kelly, RSM Shakespeare Symposium in 1997. She was also co-founder of Theatre-on-the-Green in 1987. In 1997, she was awarded the College Misericordia Alumni Association Catherine McAuley Medal for Leadership. In 1991, she was named professor emerita of College Misericordia. She was preceded in death by her sisters, Rose Mary Dunn and Marguerite Abraham; and brothers, Matthew and James.

Surviving are her nieces, nephews, great-nieces, great-nephews, and one great great-nephew. Memorial donations may be made to the Retirement Fund, Sisters of Mercy, P.O. Box 369, Dallas, 18612.

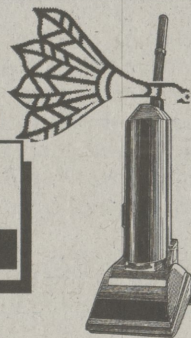

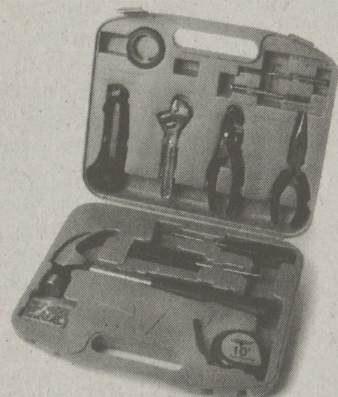
