Murphy tutors calculus at Syracuse

Paul Murphy of Dallas, a senior majoring in bioengineering at Syracuse University, was named an Academic Excellence Workshop Facilitator for the L.C. Smith College of Engineering and Computer Science for the 2001-02 academic year.

The Academic Excellence Workshop (AEW) provides a unique approach to calculus instruction by supplementing

classroom teaching through a highly interactive, small-group session. The AEW Facilitators excelled in calculus previously and work with six to eight students who volunteer for two hours of tutoring each week.

The facilitator is trained not to do the work for the students, but to encourage them to work in teams, using the language of the course to solve problems.

Wyoming Seminary Upper School senior Lydia M. Ngonyi, Lehman, has been honored for her academic achievements by the National Achievement Scholarship Program



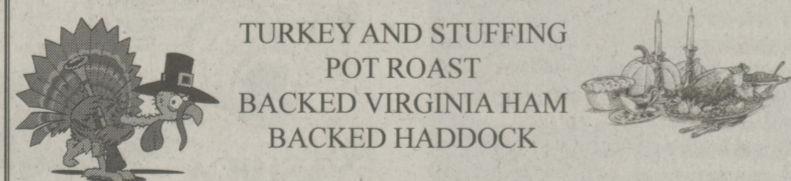

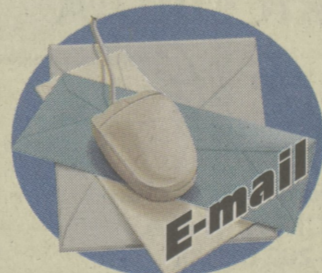
