1,017 weddings and 776 funerals during the past 50 years."

The original intent for the Gate of Heaven building was to house only the school. But by the time it opened, it had taken on the life of a church as well. The school offers preschool through the eighth grade. The church, started by only 20 families, now offers a place of worship for more than 1,000 families.

"The original plan was to have the cafeteria in the room where we hold church services," said Father Jack Lambert, who has served at the church for the last four years. "For the last 50 years we have been saying that we'll build a church some day. We are looking at plans now to build a church at a nearby location because we are bulging at the seams.

The school also has grown with the community.

"We opened the school offering only six grades. Then we built the new school wing in 1957. We have needed more room for a long time," he said. "We are committed to offering Catholic education to our students, and we need more space to do that. We believe in this faith component that gives our students spiritual guidance to help develop their morals and core values.

Father Jack, as his parishioners fondly call him, presides over a mass every day at 7 a.m. "It sets the tone and starts my day," he said. "A number come faithfully every morning. We have a strong faith life here at Gate of Heaven. We have a real sense of hospitality, cama-

In other business: Paul Degillio, Foreman informed board Burkavage, members that as in all construction, an unforeseen expense has presented itself in the renovation phase of the Dallas Middle School project.

In redesigning the locker rooms, workers discovered the floor slab concrete varies from 8 to 18 inches in the thickened reinforced slab. The removal of the slab is necessary to install the new plumbing for the locker rooms. "The conditions are drastically different than the drawings," Degillio said.

After testing the soil below the slab and finding it suitable for construction, Degillio said he doesn't know why the elevations are different throughout the floor slab. Degillio said a number of different firms will be solicited for prices on the unexpected work and presented to, monwealth."




