They are currently payable at the penalty value listed on the tax bill. If a receipt is desired, please enclose a self-addressed stamped envelope.

All unpaid property taxes will

be returned to the Luzerne County Tax Claim Bureau for delinquent collection. The delinquent township per capita is collected by the McHose Agency, and the school per capita is collected by H.A. Berkheimer Associates. Each of these agencies charges a considerable delinquent fee.
