Penn State Master Gardener Program accepting applications

Penn State Cooperative Extension in Luzerne County is now accepting applications for the 2002 Penn State Master Gardener Program.

This program consists of a volunteer training course designed to provide experienced home gardeners with the information and skills necessary to share their experience and knowledge with others. Weekly classes will be held from 1-4 p.m. beginning February 5 and ending April 9, 2002. In exchange for 30 hours of

indoor instruction, candidates must agree to donate 50 hours of volunteer service to Penn State Cooperative Extension within the first year.

Volunteer activities might include conducting garden clinics, demonstration gardens, answering home horticulture calls in our office, educational exhibits at various shows or fairs, working with 4-H youth, speaking at a community, church, or civic club, and the list goes on. To maintain the status of

Master Gardener, candidates must attend eight hours of update training and donate 20 hours of volunteer time each year after the first.

There is a \$45 fee to cover the cost of the training manual and other materials. Applications are being accepted through December 7.
