Stars of Moscow State Circus comes to Scranton, Feb. 20

Stars of the world famous Moscow State Circus will perform at Lackawanna College, in Scranton on Wednesday, Feb. 20 for two shows only, 4:30 and 7:30 p.m. The enviable reputation of the Russian circus is based on 200 years of tradition, but in particular 70 years of massive state support under the Communist regime. Through the development of state circus schools in Moscow and other major cities, circus developed in quality and on a scale unknown in other countries, and from the 1950s became a highly successful cultural export. The fall of Communism has thrown this massive cultural organization into disarray and the future is uncertain. These performances allow residents of the area to glimpse the glory of this part of Russia's impressive cultural heritage. Ticket prices are \$15/adult; children age 14 and under are \$7.50 at the door or free with coupons available at area merchants and fast food restaurants.

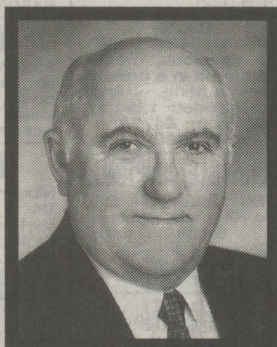

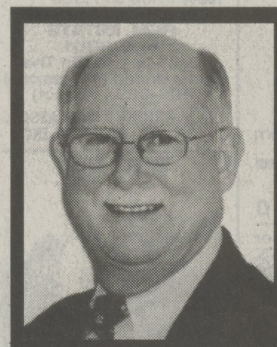

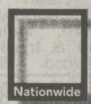
