Lake-Lehman School District policy states a child must be 5 years of age on or before September 1, 2002 in order to register for kindergarten for the 2002-2003 school year. Parents are asked to bring all

Dallas to hold kindergarten registration

Griffiths, Superintendent of the Dallas School District, announces Kindergarten Registration for the 2002-03 school year will be held from 9 a.m. to 11 a.m. and 1 p.m. to 4 p.m. on March 18, 19, 20, and 21 in the gymnasium of the Gerald J. Wycallis Elementary School on Conyngham Ave., Dallas. A Birth Certificate or other acceptable evidence of age and the Social Security Card must accompany each registration. A child must be five years of age on or before September 1, 2002 to make him/her eligible for kindergarten.

Those with last names beginning with A, B, C, D, E and F will register on Monday, March 18 those with G, H, I, J, K and L on Tuesday, March 19 those with M, N, O, P, Q and R on Wednesday, March 20 and those with S, T, U, V, W, X, Y and Z on Thursday, March 21. In addition to the registration, vision and speech screenings will be given. Kindergarten teachers will be available to answer any questions or concerns. Parents must bring all records of their child's immunizations.

Bishop O'Reilly students attend Governor's Schools

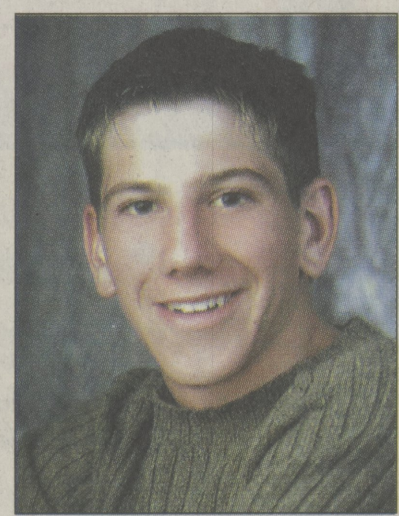
