DISTRICT COURT BRIEFS

DRUG CHARGES FILED

Charges against Crystal M. Visnecki, 27, of PO Box 77 Market Street, Noxen, were held over to county court. They include: false reports to law enforcement officials, drug possession and possession of drug paraphernalia.

According to arrest papers, Visneski was stopped by Dallas Borough police officer James Martin for speeding.

Visneski identified herself as Ronalee Visneski, but her actual identity was established when Martin found her driver's license while searching her vehicle, said police.

Various forms of drug paraphernalia, including two bags of heroin, were found in Visneski's purse, according to arrest papers.

BAD CHECKS PASSED

Jessica Evans, 27, of 745 Park Ave., Shavertown, pled guilty to charges she wrote a bad check in front of District Magistrate James Tupper, totalling \$40.57 at Kern Brothers Distributors, Dallas.

BURGLARY CHARGES

A Kingston man had charges against him held over to county court stemming from an October 17, 2001 robbery at a preliminary hearing in front of District Magistrate James Tupper.

The charges include: burglary, criminal trespassing, theft and criminal mischief.

Donald Korus Jr., 24, of 127 Penn Street, Kingston, will stand trial on charges of burglary, criminal trespass and criminal mischief.

According to arrest papers, Korus robbed a Dallas home he had worked in four months earlier, taking over \$11,400.00 in jewelry, handguns and cash from the home.

Police seized a screwdriver thought to be used in the alleged burglary found in the trunk of Korus' car, police said.

Castings taken from the crime scene and an analysis of the screwdriver shows white residue taken from the screwdriver matches that of the paint around the molding of a door used to enter the residence during the alleged burglary, according to arrest papers.
