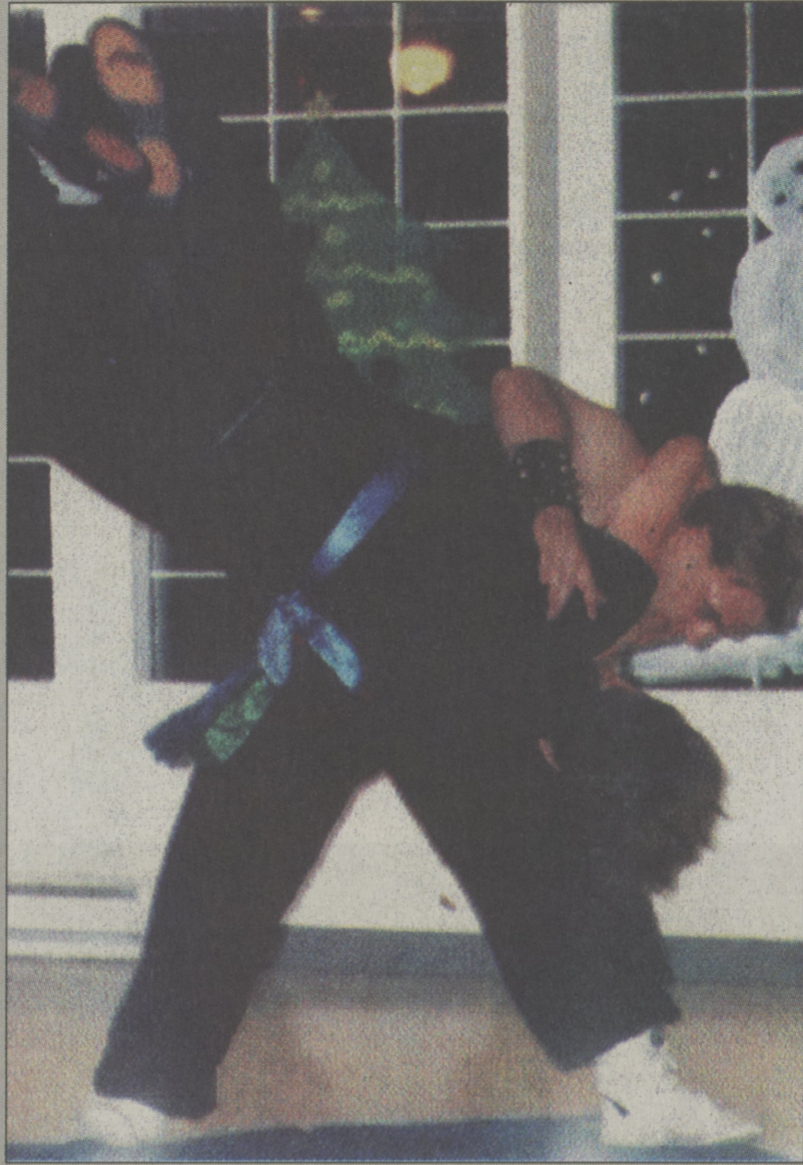

LL, Dallas wrestlers advance to Regionals

Lake-Lehman head coach Phil Lipski knows his team will have their work cut out for them this weekend. He even makes no secret of the fact that it will down right hard to score team points at the PIAA Class 2A Northeast Regional Wrestling Tournament this weekend at Williamsport High School. "The real test will be (this) weekend," said Lipski. "The competition is on another level, and it will be a lot harder to score points." The Black Knights will send 10 wrestlers to this weekend's tournament, which gets underway at 6 p.m. Friday, with quarterfinal and first round consolation action. Lehman will look to district champions John Houssock (112 pounds), Matt Dragon (119) and Willie Weber (152), and district runner-up Matt Carey (HWT) to score points, and the quartet stands a good chance of moving on to the PIAA Class 2A State Championships March 7, 8, and 9 at Hersheypark Arena. Houssock (26-7) will meet Bloomsburg sophomore Zach Schnee (37-6) in the opening round, while Dragon (33-5) opens his first trip to the Regional Championship against Mount Carmel junior Eric McAndrew (29-6), and Weber will meet Northeast Bradford's Stephen Laudermlch (30-9). Other Black Knights in action this weekend will be: Kelby Morgan (103), seeded fourth, Aaron Kubasik (125), Ryan Post (130), Matt Stuart (160), Bob Morris (171) and Ed Becker (189). Dallas will send a trio of wrestlers to the Class 3A Regional Tournament at Bethlehem-Liberty High School. Senior Todd Jones (145), junior Perry Coolbaugh (152) and freshman John Hettes (119) each qualified for Regionals after placing in the District 2 Class 3A Championships Feb. 23.
