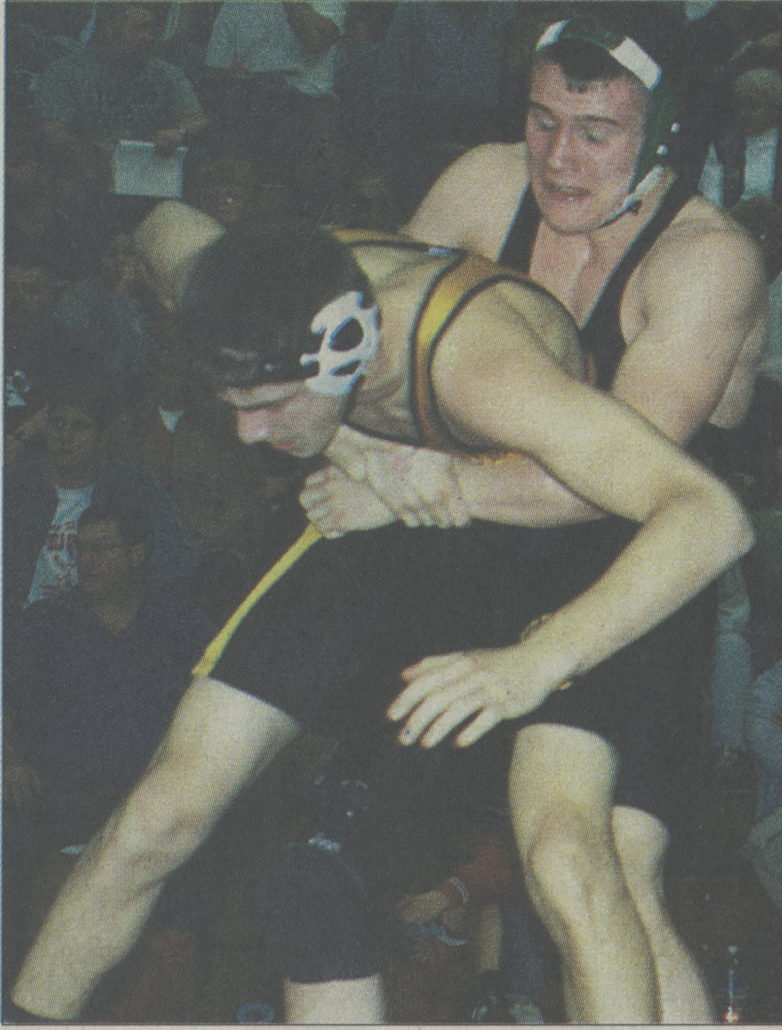

I tie in regulation, much the same way they did last week, with each collecting escapes in the second and third periods.

But Carey was able to use his legs to keep Ostrowski from getting the escape, and held on for the win.

"They are both afraid to make that one mistake that will cost them the match," said Mohawk head coach Dave Kuhl. "They have been working together the last couple of weeks, and know what each other does in the match."

Including Carey, the Black Knights will send four wrestlers to this week's PIAA Class 2A State Championships at Hershey Park Arena.

John Houssock (4th, 112 pounds), Willie Weber (4th, 152) and Ed Becker (4th, 189) each wrestled back through consolations to qualify for the state tournament.

Becker was a surprise of the tournament for the WVC. The Black Knight senior (31-11) fell to Troy Charles of Hughesville in the quarterfinals, but fought back through the consolation bracket, defeating top-seeded Eric Miller (33-2) of Montrose in the consolation semifinals. He fell to District 2 champion Kyle Davis of Valley View in the consolation finals.

"I worked really hard at practice all week, and just wanted to do well (at Regionals)," said Becker, who will make his first trip to the state tournament.

Lake-Lehman freshman Matt Dragon (119), seeded second coming into the tournament, ended his season with a fifth-place finish.

Dragon (35-7) scored a major decision over Jaryd Steinbacher (25-11) of Montgomery, 13-2, in the fifth-place final.

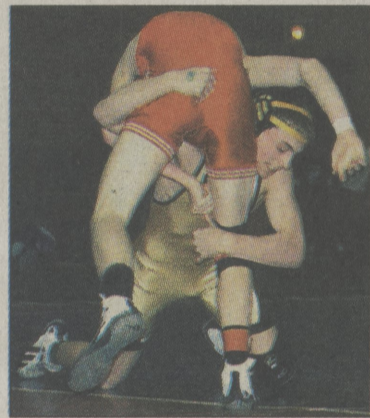

"The morning matches were tough for us," said Lake-Lehman head coach Phil Lipski. "But the kids came back, and it is great that we are sending four to states."
