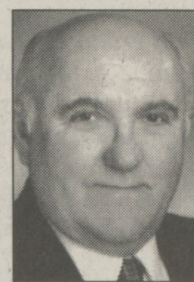
**Post honored at SCI-Dallas for 20 years of service**
